

# WASTE DISPOSAL LICENCE SCHEDULE OF CONDITIONS

WASTE DISPOSAL LICENCE REFERENCE NUMBER: F026

SITE: WOOLLISS'S YARD, RAILWAY STREET, GRIMSBY

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1. This licence relates to the area outlined in red on the attached plan no. WMS/026. This area is hereafter referred to as "the site".
2. The area hatched in green within the licensed area on the attached plan no. WMS/026 is excluded from this licence.
3. The licensee shall notify the Waste Regulation Authority in writing of any proposed change in the conduct of operations from the proposals described within the attached Statement of Intent and illustrated on the attached plan no. WMS/026 at least one month before the proposed change is implemented. Any such change will be approved or rejected in writing by the Waste Regulation Authority.
4. The types and maximum quantities of waste which may be deposited are specified in the attached "Schedule of Permitted Wastes", Appendix 1.
5. A copy of the site licence and the Schedule of Conditions attached thereto shall be displayed at the site office.
6. A person shall be designated as responsible for the security and satisfactory operation of the site, and the Waste Regulation Authority shall be notified of the person's name, address and telephone number. Any change shall be communicated to the Waste Regulation Authority immediately and confirmed in writing.
7. The conditions attached to the site licence shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management, supervision or control of the site for any period.
8. Emergency instructions and telephone numbers shall be kept and displayed at the facility. A copy of such instructions shall be forwarded to the Waste Regulation Authority for approval.
9. A site control office shall be provided and maintained from which supervision of the site shall be carried out.
10. A site log-book shall be kept at the site office in which the records required by the Waste Regulation Authority and any comments made by officers of the Waste Regulation Authority shall be recorded. The site log book shall be made available to officers of the Waste Regulation Authority on demand.

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11. A site identification board of durable material and finish shall be erected at the site entrance showing the following information:-
- a) name and address of the site operator and 24 hour telephone number(s).
  - b) the opening hours of the site.
  - c) particulars of the Waste Regulation Authority in the following terms:-

12. No wastes shall be deposited outside the following hours without the prior approval of the Waste Regulation Authority:-

13. If the facility is to be used during the hours of darkness adequate lighting shall be provided and maintained in working order so as to ensure safe working conditions at all times. The hours of darkness shall be those covered by statutory lighting-up times published by the Science Research Council.
14. Gates, fences and walls shall be provided and maintained to such standard as to prevent unauthorised access to the site.
15. A written record shall be kept at the site office of all waste deposited at the site and of all waste, and its destination, which is removed from the site. The information recorded shall be made available to officers of the Waste Regulation Authority on demand and shall include:-
- (a) the type of waste as classified by Condition no. 4
  - (b) the waste carrier involved
  - (c) the quantity of waste in tonnes
  - (d) the date of deposit
  - (e) the date of removal
16. The total quantity of waste delivered to and removed from the site in each calendar year ending 31st December shall be calculated from the record compiled in accordance with Condition 15 and shall include sub-totals for each category of waste listed in Condition 4. The annual totals shall be submitted in writing to the Waste Regulation Authority before 31st January of the succeeding year.

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17. No wastes shall be permitted to be deposited at any time other than when the site is manned.
18. All waste received shall be inspected to ensure compliance with Condition 4. Any waste not in compliance with Condition 4 shall be placed in a secure storage area within the site and the Waste Regulation Authority informed immediately. The Authority shall be given not less than 24 hours' notice of the proposed method of dealing with the rejected waste. The waste shall be removed from the site within 7 days of the date of receipt.
19. The site shall be manned and supervised throughout the working hours having due regard to the security and safe operational requirements of the site.
20. To control any infestation by insects or vermin, the entire site shall be inspected and disinfection measures applied as found necessary. Records of dates of inspections and disinfection measures applied shall be kept in the site log book.
21. No material of any kind whatsoever shall be burned within the boundaries of the site, and a fire at the site shall be regarded as an emergency and immediate action shall be taken to extinguish it. All outbreaks of fire shall be notified forthwith to the Waste Regulation Authority.
22. A written record of all outbreaks of fire and remedial action taken shall be kept in the site log book.
23. The Waste Regulation Authority shall be immediately informed of any incident that could give rise to danger to public health, pollution of water, or could be seriously detrimental to local amenities.
24. All necessary action shall be taken to prevent the dissemination of odour, fumes, dust or windblown material.
25. Measures shall be provided and used for the effective cleansing of the wheels and bodies of vehicles leaving the site to ensure that mud, debris or any other material is not deposited on any roadway. These measures shall include the sweeping of the site entrance and public highway leading from the site.
26. The maximum height of stored waste shall not exceed 3.5 metres.
27. The discovery of friable/fibrous asbestos material during the dismantling/cutting of any waste shall be notified to the Waste Regulation Authority. Such asbestos shall be placed into polythene bags (minimum 500 gauge) and double bagged. When filled the bags shall be sealed so as to prevent the escape of dust and be stored in a waterproof and secure area. Bags shall be removed and disposed of without delay to an appropriately licensed disposal site, in accordance with The Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980.

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28. Within three months from the date of this licence a scheme shall be implemented to the satisfaction of the Waste Regulation Authority whereby, on arrival, vehicles or any other equipment intended for crushing, dismantling or separation, and containing liquids shall be either:
  - (a) drained of oil, petrol, diesel, coolant and hydraulic fluid to suitable containers on an impermeable, bunded standing area which drains to a blind sump or interceptor, or
  - (b) drained of oil, petrol, diesel, coolant and hydraulic fluid to suitable containers on an impermeable based surface within a building.
29. In the event of the accumulation of surface water or the formation of mud on the site, and if deemed necessary by the Waste Regulation Authority, a scheme detailing provisions for drainage shall be submitted to the Waste Regulation Authority for written approval.
30. When not in use all pressurised gas bottles shall be stored in a secure designated area or building or as otherwise agreed in writing with the Waste Regulation Authority.
31. Any oil/fuel storage tanks shall be located within a bund having an effective capacity, maintained at all times, of not less than 110% of the largest tank. If tanks are connected to pipework in such a way as to allow equalisation of the level of the contents, then the bund capacity shall be 110% of the largest combined volume. The floor and walls of the bund shall be impervious to oil/fuel and water. Inlet/outlet/vent pipes and gauges must be within the bunded area. Adequate arrangements to the satisfaction of the Waste Regulation Authority shall be made for the disposal of contaminated surface water from within the bund.
32. Only sound drums or other containers capable of being sealed, opened for inspection and effectively resealed shall be used for the storage of liquid waste.
33. Drums or other containers used to store liquids shall be located within a bund, the floor and walls of which shall be impervious. The bund shall have a capacity of not less than 110% of the largest container to be stored.
34. Drums or other containers used to store liquids shall be clearly labelled so as to identify their contents. Any inappropriate names or markings shall be obliterated.
35. All engines, gearboxes and other oil contaminated components shall only be stored in leakproof containers, unless alternative proposals have been approved in writing by the Waste Regulation Authority.
36. Batteries received at the site shall be initially stored within an area provided with an impermeable base so as to prevent contamination of the underlying ground occurring. The area shall also be covered so as to prevent the ingress of water into it.
37. Batteries awaiting removal from the site shall be either stored in leakproof containers covered so as to prevent the ingress of water, or stacked uniformly on pallets and wrapped in such a way as to prevent ingress of water and the escape of any liquids.

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## ADVISORY NOTES

- (i) In the event of any accident resulting in the death or serious bodily injury to any person as a result of operations on the site, the licensee should notify the enforcing authority for the purposes of the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974. In most cases this will be the Health and Safety Executive, but for offices, shops and distribution centres will be the Environmental Health Department of the Local Authority.
- (ii) In complying with the licensing provisions of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 the site occupier is not absolved from his responsibilities under other requirements of the Act and any other relevant legislation, including the Health and Safety at Work Act, the Town and Country Planning Acts, the Public Health Acts, the Clean Air Acts, the Alkali etc. Works Regulations and Orders and the C.O.S.H.H. Regulations.
- (iii) Health and Safety Executive guidance note HS(G)51 gives guidance on the storage of flammable liquid in containers.
- (iv) Health and Safety Executive guidance note HS(G)50 gives guidance on the storage of flammable liquids in fixed tanks (up to 10,000m<sup>3</sup> total capacity).
- (v) Any liquid discharge into watercourses and drainage systems requires the approval of the National Rivers Authority (Anglian Region).

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## SCHEDULE OF PERMITTED WASTES

### Category 1

Scrap Vehicles

### Category 2

Motor Vehicle Batteries

### Category 3

Ferrous and non-ferrous scrap metal

THE WASTE INTAKE SHALL ALSO COMPLY WITH THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS:-

- (i) The total quantity of waste delivered to the site shall not exceed 4,999 tonnes per annum.
- (ii) Any waste defined as special waste in The Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980 shall not be accepted at the site unless accompanied by relevant copies of CONSIGNMENT NOTES FOR THE CARRIAGE AND DISPOSAL OF HAZARDOUS WASTES, as specified in aforementioned Regulations.

STATEMENT OF INTENT

The business carried out at the above premises is the collection and recovery or acceptance, of Ministry of Transport failures, scrap or accident damaged, cars, light commercials and motor cycles from most sources.

All vehicles arriving at the premises are recorded upon entry at the site office. From there they are either sold as a complete item or broken down for spare parts. Records of all transactions are kept on site.

When vehicles become no longer viable to keep they are moved to an area of the yard that has been allocated for the final dismantling. This area is used by ourselves only and is out of bounds for unauthorised persons.

Machinery used, other than recovery vehicles, are fork lift type trucks.

After all usable parts have been removed by customers or ourselves, the remains are taken to the final dismantling area where the last of heavy metals are removed i.e. engines gearboxes axles etc. These items are sorted and stored until there is an amount sufficient to sell. This metal, or waste, is then placed in a skip for removal by our agents. The remains or body shells are stacked and stored until approximately seventy are on stock and then sold to a crushing agent who comes with crushing machine and lorry to remove.

Note: Batteries are removed upon entry to the site. These are sorted and stored in containers.

No liquids other than water, petrol and oil are removed.

Security at the site is by boundary walls and fences.

Working hours vary only a little with no yard work being carried on in the hours of darkness, apart from accident recovery.

The yard is staffed by two full time employees and the occasional casual help.

It is firm's intention to erect engine storage compartments for storage of engines and gear boxes where facilities are not immediately available. There is no noise, fumes or other obvious nuisance on site.
