O Rashid now identified as the site Manager.

S Frisby remains as site TCM.

Site manager outlined how the PFOS / PFAS treatment trial had progressed and how the water authority was content with the discharge to the sewer.

I understand to minimise the traffic impact / parking on the trading estate, Yellowstone have rented land on the estate to hold vehicles until they processed at the site.

IBC area

- Rows being maintained (IBCs 3 high)
- A container IBC off loading acceptance area has been created at the north end of the yard.
- A small number of the IBCs have some structural damage to the external packaging. We discussed the to ensure the integrity of the IBCs.
- A hired boiler on site as the onsite plant under repair, this currently restricts the area available for IBC storage.
- All viewed IBCs were labelled.

Yard area

- Concrete surface across the yard good
- Bund walls around tank farm appear in good order.
- Site tanks appear sound
- No liquids with bund.
- PFOS/ PFAS trial tanks, input tank individually banded in main yard, the filter tanks and output tank all within site building.

Should it be decided to extend the trial to a long-term site treatment activity the current arrangements will need to best practice standards.

- Oil/ sludge treatment area in good order, tri-canter in operation. Viewed the solid fraction output -no odours / no residual liquids
- Odour suppression sprays operational, no site odours identified.
