CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT 1974 WASTE DISPOSAL LICENCE

1. The Waste Regulation Authority hereby grant a Waste Disposal Licence to Mr N Grist

of Park View Farm, Webbs Lane, Bath Road, Devizes,
Wiltshire, SN10 1PP

for land occupied at Tinkfield, Andover Road, Devizes
subject to the conditions listed overleaf.

2. This licence is issued in accordance with Part 1 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974. The licence holder must ensure that all other relevant legislation is complied with. Attention is particularly drawn to the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, the Radioactive Substances Act 1960 and planning, water protection and environmental health legislation.

NOTES

Rights of Appeal

If a licence holder is aggrieved by the decision of the Waste Regulation Authority in granting a licence subject to conditions he may appeal to the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 10 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974. Appeals must be notified within 6 months of the date of this licence to The Secretary of State, Department of the Environment, Waste Disposal Division, Queen Anne's Chambers, 28 Broadway, London SW1H 9JU. The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to exercise this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of an appeal.

Conditions

1. A working plan, giving details of the proposed conduct of operations at the site shall be submitted to the Licensing Authority within one month of this licence being issued. The licence holder shall notify the Licensing Authority of any proposed change in the actual conduct of operations from the proposals shown in the plan at least one month before the proposed change is implemented.
2. Types of Waste
 - i. The types and quantities of waste deposited daily at the site shall not exceed the limit of the operator's ability to deal with them.
 - ii. The types of waste which can be deposited are:-
 - a) Soil and subsoil.
 - b) Rubble and other inert material from building works.
 - c) Solid, dry, non-hazardous waste which shall comprise:

glass metal, incidental paper, cardboard, ceramics, plastics, empty containers, fabrics, wood and hard waste containing asbestos.
 - iii. Waste subject to the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980 made under Section 17 of the Control of Pollution Act shall not be deposited.

Any asbestos which may form part of (c) above shall be immediately covered on deposit with inert material in such a manner as to eliminate any risk of dust.

Site Work Conditions

3. Site roads shall be maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the Licensing Authority.

4. Such action as may reasonably be necessary shall be taken to prevent the deposit of mud on public highways by vehicles travelling from the tip.
5. A site identification board of durable material and finish shall be displayed at the site entrance, giving the name of the site, the name, address and telephone number of the operator and of the Licensing Authority responsible for issuing the site licence.
6. Deposits of waste shall not encroach on the uncultivated section of the stream. If it is necessary to tip on this area then the stream shall be culverted. Before any culverting work takes place the consent of the Regional Water Authority must be obtained and the works of culverting carried out to their and the Licensing Authority's satisfaction.
7. Movable screens shall be provided as necessary at intervals near operational areas having regard to wind direction so as to ensure that paper and other materials are contained on the site. Materials arrested by such screens shall be removed and disposed of as necessary to maintain the efficiency of the screens and the tidiness of the site.
8. The fence and gates provided shall be maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the licensing Authority and precautions shall be taken to prevent unauthorised access. The entrance gates must be kept locked at all times when a responsible employee is not present on site. The gates and fencing where it adjoins the road shall be 2m high.
9. Solid waste shall be compacted and formed into a layer as soon as possible after deposit and not later than at the end of the working day on which the waste is received.
10. The depth of a layer of waste shall not after initial compaction exceed 2.5 metres.
11. Materials used for landfill other than that which is wholly non-putrescible shall, subject to the traction needs of vehicles operating at the working face, be covered progressively, as necessary, with suitable non-putrescible or stabilized material so that all exposed surfaces, including the flanks and face, shall be covered to a depth of not less than 15 centimetres.
12. All large articles such as furniture, crates and hollow containers likely to cause voids shall be crushed, broken up or flattened and covered each day by other wastes in such a position that they are not within one metre of the surface or two metres of the flanks or face.
13. Waste other than uncontaminated soil and subsoil shall not be deposited in water.
14. Not less frequently than once a week any loose waste which may be lying on the site shall be gathered and disposed of

in such a way as to keep the site tidy.

15. No waste material shall be burnt within the boundaries of the site, and a fire at the site shall be regarded as an emergency and immediate action shall be taken to extinguish it. All outbreaks of fire shall be notified forthwith to the Licensing Authority.
16. Precautions shall be taken to deal effectively with any vermin and insects on the site.
17. A record shall be kept of the types and quantities of waste deposited.
18. The terms of the site licence shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management or control of the site.
19. Adequate precautions shall be taken to avoid dust nuisance including, if necessary, the use of water sprays.
20. All plant and machinery shall be properly maintained and operated so as to prevent nuisance from noise and fumes.
21. Each layer of waste and covering material shall be laid to a fall to encourage surface water run-off.
22. Suitable precautions to the satisfaction of the Regional Water Authority shall be taken to protect the 4" diameter water main which crosses the site adjoining and parallel with the road.
23. Such works as may be required by the Licensing Authority and the Regional Water Authority shall be taken to prevent water pollution.
