A11. General considerations

A11.1 Specified waste management operations

No waste management operations shall be authorised by this licence unless: specified in and undertaken in accordance with the limitations in sections 6.0, 7.0 and 8.0 of the working plan and in the following table; or otherwise required by the conditions of this licence as being an integral part of those operations:

A11.2 Specified Waste Management Operations and Exempt Waste Management Operations

Where wastes are being brought onto the site for waste management operations which are exempt from licensing under the 1994 Regulations, then the wastes which are subject to the specified waste management operations shall be kept clearly segregated and identified from those wastes which are being kept on the site for the exempt waste management operations.

A12 Hours of operation

The waste management operations authorised by this licence shall only be carried out within the times specified in section 1.1 of the working plan.

B13 Site security

Site security systems shall be provided at all times during the subsistence of this licence, the objective of which shall be to prevent access by humans and livestock which is not authorised either by the Licence Holder or under legal powers of entry. These shall be installed, operated and maintained, and

shall be fully documented and recorded, in accordance with section 11 of the working plan and the following requirements:

- Any vehicular or pedestrian access to the site shall be secured by lockable gates to the standards specified in the current working plan.
- Gates shall be locked out of the hours specified in Condition A12 other than in an emergency, and in any case whenever the site is not manned.
- The gates shall be inspected each working day and any damage repaired within 7 days of being detected.

C16 Permitted wastes

C16.1 Permitted categories and types of wastes

No wastes other than those, which are both, categorised below in Table C16 and specified in detail in section 1.2 of the working plan, shall be accepted at the site.

C16.2 Permitted quantities of wastes

The quantities of wastes accepted shall not exceed those listed in Table C16 Whilst complying with the maximum quantities specified for each type of waste, the total quantity of waste accepted at the site per day shall not exceed 250 tonnes and per year shall not exceed 74,999 tonnes.

RIGHTS OF APPEAL

Section 43(1) of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 provides that:

Where, except in pursuance of a direction given by the Secretary of State, the conditions of a licence are modified, the licence holder may appeal from the decision to the Secretary of State.

This notice of appeal should be accompanied by the following information:

- A statement of the grounds of appeal;
- A copy of any application to modify the licence
- A copy of the licence;
- A copy of any correspondence relevant to the appeal;
- A copy of any other document relevant to the appeal including, in particular, any relevant consent, determination, notice, planning permission, established use certificate or certificate of lawful use or development and
- A statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or on the basis of written representations.

You are also required to serve a copy of your notice of appeal, together with copies of any the above documents that have accompanied your notice of appeal, on the Environment Agency (at the address overleaf). You should appeal within 6 months of the date that this notice takes effect but the Secretary of State may allow notice of appeal to be given after the expiry of this time period.
