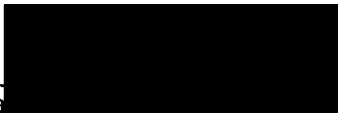

WHEREAS on the 3 October 1990 the Staffordshire County Council issued a waste disposal licence (now to be treated as a waste management licence) in pursuance of its powers under Part 1 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 for the above named facility to you

AND WHEREAS on the 1st April 1996 the powers and duties of all waste regulation authorities in England and Wales transferred to the Environment Agency ("the Agency") by virtue of section 2 of the Environment Act 1995

AND WHEREAS on 8 August 1994, 31 March 1997 and 22 July 2004 the said licence was modified

D28 Site operations

Waste pre-acceptance and acceptance procedures

D28.1 Prior to receipt at the site, all foundry sands and slags shall be sampled and tested or a suitable recent analysis obtained from the producer which confirms that the waste is acceptable at the site, in accordance with section 4.9 of the working plan.

D28.2 All loads of waste received at the site shall be visually inspected prior to deposit to ensure that they are acceptable at the site.

F6 Site Records

Recording of wastes accepted

F6.1 The licence holder shall produce and keep a record of all incoming loads to include:

- The name and address of the person or company producing the waste.
- The name and address of the person or company depositing the load.
- The weight or volume of each load.
- The type of waste in each load.
- The pre-acceptance analysis results and interpretative reports.

- C17.1. No wastes other than those, which are both categorised in Table C17 and specified in detail in section 1.2 of the working plan, shall be accepted at the site.

Permitted quantities of waste

- C17.2 The quantities of waste accepted shall not exceed those listed in Table C17. Whilst complying with the maximum quantities specified for each type of waste, the total quantity of waste accepted at the site per day shall not exceed 250 tonnes and per year shall not exceed 74,999 tonnes.

This notice of appeal should be accompanied by the following information:

A statement of the grounds of appeal;

A copy of any application to modify the licence;

A copy of the licence;

A copy of any correspondence relevant to the appeal;

A copy of any other document relevant to the appeal including, in particular, any relevant consent, determination, notice, planning permission, established use certificate or certificate of lawful use or development; and

A statement indicating whether you wish the appeal to be in the form of a hearing or on the basis of written representations.

You are also required to serve a copy of your notice of appeal, together with copies of any the above documents that have accompanied your notice of appeal, on the Environment Agency (at the address overleaf). You should appeal within 6 months of the date that this notice takes effect but the Secretary of State may allow notice of appeal to be given after the expiry of this time period.
