- (a) Subject to paragraph 5 (b), no wastes other than scrap metal as defined in the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 1964 shall be accepted at the site.
 - (b) The following wastes shall be specifically excluded from acceptance at the site.
 - i) clinical wastes;
 - ii) substances controlled by the Radioactive Substances Act 1960;
 - iii) substances controlled by the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971;
 - iv) percussives and explosives
 - v) flammable solvents;
 - vi) transformers and capacitors and other electrical equipment known or assumed to contain polychlorinated bi-phenyl;
 - vii) batteries;
 - viii) asbestos;
 - xi) special waste as defined by regulations in force under Section 62 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 with the exception of special waste which forms part of, or is contained in, a waste motor vehicle and was necessary for the normal operation of the vehicle.
