1. The Licence Holder shall operate the site in accordance with the plan(s) and details attached to this Licence. The Licence Holder shall notify the Waste Disposal Authority of any proposed change in the actual conduct of operations from the proposals shown in the plan and details attached to this Licence, as altered by any previously notified changes, at least one month before the proposed change is implemented.
2. The types of wastes accepted at the site unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Waste Disposal Authority shall be as described in the attached schedule.
3. No poisonous, noxious or polluting waste shall be accepted at the site except as detailed in the attached schedule. Any such waste shall be dealt with as specified in the details attached to this Licence.
4. Suitable and sufficient reception tanks/vessels/drums shall be provided within the site for the reception of waste battery acid/waste oil/waste diesel/waste petroleum.
5. Operating hours shall be from 0800 hours to 1700 hours Monday to Friday inclusive and 0800 hours to 1200 hours on Saturday.
6. Operations shall not take place during the hours covered by official lighting up times (i.e. half-an-hour after sunset to half-an-hour before sunrise) unless adequate lighting is provided.
7. Adequate measures shall be taken to prevent the deposit of mud, oil, grease or metal fragments on the highway as a result of site operations.
8. Within two months from the date of commencement of operations under this Licence, a Site Identification Board of durable material and finish shall be displayed and maintained at a suitable point near the site access showing the times when the site is open, giving the licence number and the name and telephone number of the operator and of the Waste Disposal Authority responsible for issuing the site licence.
9. All tanks/vessels and drums used for storage of waste shall be suitably labelled to describe their contents. Any inappropriate name markings and other identifications shall be obliterated.
10. All bulk storage vessels used in connection with the operation of the site shall be suitably designed and constructed and they shall be maintained to ensure that they are leak-proof and in working order whenever in use.
11. Any liquid storage tanks shall be located within a bund having a capacity of not less than 110% of the largest tank. If tanks are connected by pipework in such a way as to allow equalisation of the level of contents, then the bund capacity shall be 110% of the largest combined volume. The floor and walls of the bund shall be impervious to oil and water (and resistant to any stored chemicals). Inlet/outlet/vent pipes and gauges must be within the bunded area. The disposal of contaminated surface water from within the bund shall be carried out in a manner agreed with the Waste Disposal Authority.

12. The defined area where any recoverable liquids are removed from scrap metal waste and any storage area for liquids shall be adequately surfaced to prevent contamination of the underlying ground occurring.
13. Whenever waste handling operations are being carried out the site shall be adequately manned to ensure compliance with the conditions of this licence.
14. Whenever waste handling operations are being carried out the site shall be supervised by a person competent and qualified to ensure compliance with the licence conditions.
15. Each load received shall be inspected to ensure compliance with Conditions 2 and 3. Any waste not in compliance with Conditions 2 and 3 shall be placed in a secure storage area within the site and the Waste Disposal Authority informed immediately. The Waste Disposal Authority shall be given not less than 24 hours notice of the proposed method of dealing with the rejected waste. The waste shall be removed from the site within 7 days of the date of receipt.
16. All recoverable liquids shall be removed and emptied into the reception tanks/vessels/drums as soon as possible after receipt and in such a manner as to avoid any spillage.
17. Any spillage shall be dealt with immediately to clear or alleviate the effect of the spillage and adequate quantities of sand/absorbent material shall be on hand.
18. The discovery of friable/fibrous asbestos material during the dismantling/cutting of any waste shall be notified to the Waste Disposal Authority. Such asbestos shall be placed into polythene bags minimum 500 gauge and double bagged. When filled the bags shall be sealed so as to prevent the escape of dust and be stored in a waterproof and secure area. Bags shall be removed and disposed of without delay to an appropriately licensed disposal site, in accord with the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980.
19. The discovery of any material which could contain PCB's during dismantling of any type of item in which PCB's have been used, shall be notified to the Waste Disposal Authority. The PCB or suspected PCB material shall be stored in a secure container. Material containing PCB's or contaminated with PCB's shall be disposed of without delay to an appropriately licensed disposal facility, in accord with the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980.
20. Complete batteries shall be stored in such a manner so as to prevent spillage or leakage of acid.
21. Where any container tank/vessel is to be cut/crushed it shall be done in such a way as to prevent spillage of any contents or residue directly on to the ground, and such activities shall be carried out in the designated working area.
22. No waste material shall be burned within the boundaries of the site, other than within a properly constructed and approved furnace or fireplace.
23. All necessary action shall be taken to prevent the dissemination of odour, fumes, dust or windblown material.
24. The licensed area shall be fenced and gated sufficient to prevent unauthorised access and the gate(s) shall be kept locked at all times whilst the site is unattended. The gate(s) and fencing shall be maintained when necessary to ensure the security of the licensed area.

25. The Waste Disposal Authority shall be immediately informed of any incident that could give rise to danger to public health, pollution of water, or could be seriously detrimental to local amenity, including any fire.
26. A record shall be kept of the types, quantities and dates of waste handled and made available to the Waste Disposal Authority on request.
27. By 30th April each year while this licence is in force, a summary in a form approved by the Waste Disposal Authority of the types and quantities of waste handled at the site during the period from 1st April the previous year to 31st March, shall be submitted to the Waste Disposal Authority.
28. The terms of the licence shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management or control of the site and a copy shall be maintained at the control office for the site.

Footnotes

If asbestos, PCB's or other hazardous materials are encountered during dismantling operations the Health and Safety Executive should be contacted immediately.

All reasonable enquiries should be made to ascertain the former contents of any container, tank or vessel prior to delivery to the site and any necessary action taken. Steps should also be taken to ensure that it is completely empty and ventilated.

Comments have been received on the following matters and you are advised to consult the Authorities concerned:

1. **Yorkshire Water Services Limited, Western House, Western Way, Halifax Road, Bradford, BD6 2LZ.**

Public sewers cross the southern site. No building to be allowed either over or within 3 metres of any sewer. Access to the manholes must be available at all times for both emergency and routine maintenance purposes. There must be no discharge of contaminated surface water to any sewer without prior consultations with Yorkshire Water Services Limited.

2. **National Rivers Authority, Olympia House, Gelderd Lane, Gelderd Road, Leeds, LS12 6DD.**

No development should be carried out within 8 metres of the bank top of the River Worth. An access strip, not less than 4.5 metres wide, should be available at all times across the site from Deal Street.

There must be no discharge of contaminated surface water to any water course, underground strata, land drain or pond without prior consultations with the National Rivers Authority.

Waste Disposal Licence Application

The Company operates a skip hire service. Clean mill waste is taken direct from the point of collection to the transfer station. A land fill site is used to dispose of foundry sand and clean rubble. This again is taken direct to the tip from the point of collection. The metal broking section of the business purchases scrap metal which is sorted, graded and processed prior to it being fed back into industry as part of their raw material. Cast iron and steel scrap, along with metal turnings, are stored in the yard. Non ferrous metals are stored in the garage and store building. Old batteries are placed ~~are placed~~ in a leak proof skip and delivered by us direct to the lead works. We do not process them - they are sold as received by us. Oil for our own use is bought in 45 gallon drums and stored in the buildings. Diesel is delivered direct into the diesel storage tanks from which it is drawn when used. Oxygen and acetylene cylinders are stored in the yard. The only waste oil handled by the Company is that received from gear boxes etc., bought as scrap, which contain a limited amount of oil. The oil is drained into a receptacle and then put into Chris Metcalfe's storage tank for collection by a re-processing firm. All materials purchased are recorded. Normally the goods pass over the weigh bridge to ascertain their weight. All sales are invoiced out. A Director of the Company is daily in charge of the yard and premises.

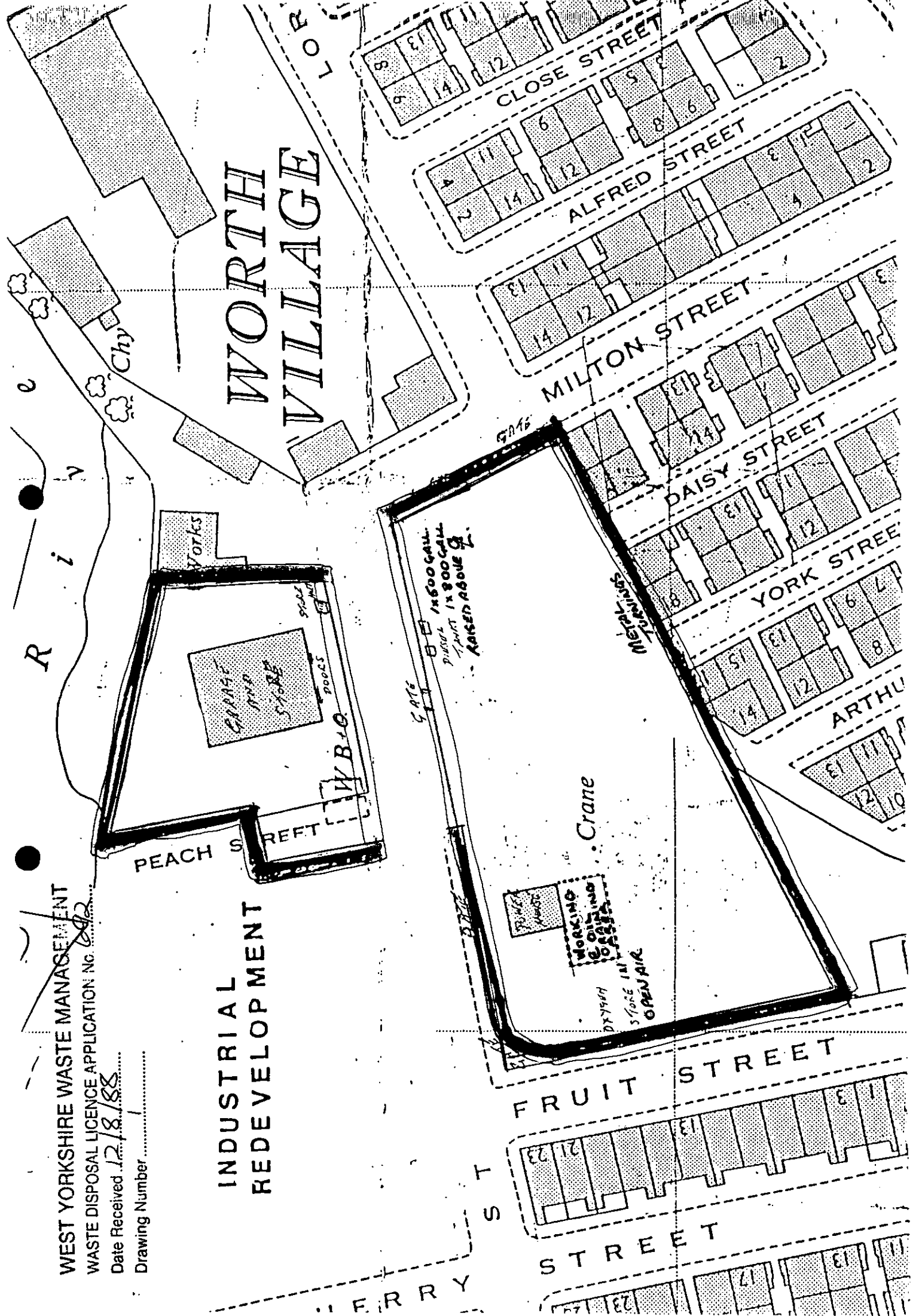

 - b). time and date received,
 - c). quantities in tonnes received and waste type - as specified by the Agency,
 - d). time and date removed,
 - e). quantities in tonnes removed and waste types - as specified by the Agency,
 - f). destination of materials removed by local authority district.
27. A summary of the information specified in condition 26. above shall be submitted to the Agency, in a format and at a frequency as required by the Agency. "

This summary shall be submitted within fourteen days of the end of the accounting period specified by the Agency.
