The following notice gives notice of the variation of an environmental permit.

The permit is varied to remove a number of acceptable waste codes whilst adding 19 12 09 (minerals). This is to aid compliance with the Landfill Tax (Qualifying Material) Order 2011 and Section 44A of the Finance Act 1996.

Waste code	Description
(1)	For the purposes of waste acceptance, soil includes naturally occurring sands and clays
(2)	Selected construction and demolition waste (C & D waste): with low contents of other types of materials (like metals, plastic, organics, wood, rubber, etc). No C & D waste from constructions, polluted with inorganic or organic dangerous substances, e.g. because of production processes in the construction, soil pollution, storage and usage of pesticides or other dangerous substances, etc., unless it is made clear that the demolished construction was not significantly polluted. No C & D waste from constructions, treated, covered or painted with materials, containing dangerous substances in significant amounts. If it is unsure whether the waste fulfils the definition of inert waste, or is uncontaminated, then testing of the waste must be undertaken to confirm compliance with the criteria for inert waste as specified in The Landfill (England and Wales) Regulations 2002 as amended. The origin of all waste must be known.
