SCHEDULE TO WDA 386

GENERAL

MOD 2/5/15 insert new condition 1.

1. No deposit of waste or use of any plant or equipment for the purposes of dealing with waste shall take place unless it is in accordance with a Working Plan for the facility, prepared and submitted to the following requirements:
  - (i) The Working Plan for the facility shall include the document entitled "Working Plan" reference SD/KJ.18 and drawing (reference H3800/17) submitted as part of the application for this Licence.
  - (ii) The Working Plan shall be supplemented by additional documents and plans detailing the proposed conduct of operations at the facility and these shall be submitted to the Waste Regulation Authority not less than one month prior to the commencement of operations.
  - (iii) The Licence holder shall notify the Waste Regulation Authority of any proposed change in the actual conduct of operations from the Working Plan, as altered by any previously notified change, at least one month before the proposed change is implemented, unless otherwise agreed.
  - (iv) A Working Plan for the facility, including amendments, shall not be implemented unless its contents have been agreed in writing by the Waste Regulation Authority.
  - (v) Not less than 14 days notice shall be given to the Waste Regulation Authority of the date on which operations are to commence or recommence in the event of a temporary cessation for a period in excess of three months.
  - (vi) Any temporary cessation of operation for a period in excess of three months shall be notified to the Waste Regulation Authority.
  - (vii) The Working Plan shall form part of this Licence. Any reference to the Working Plan shall include a reference to any modification to the Working Plan as approved by the Waste Regulation Authority.

WASTE TYPES

2. No deposit of waste shall take place unless in accordance with the following conditions:

(i) The following types of waste may be deposited at the facility, provided that the waste is listed in Appendix A.

Household and Commercial Waste as defined in Section 30 of the Control of Pollution Act, 1974 and in Schedules 1 and 4 of the Collection and Disposal of Waste Regulations 1988;

Industrial Wastes as defined in Section 30 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 and Schedule 3 of the Collection and Disposal of Waste Regulations 1988;

(ii) Difficult wastes (ref: DoE Waste Management Paper No. 2) or Special Wastes, as defined in the Control of Pollution (Special Waste) Regulations 1980, as listed below, may be deposited provided facilities are available on site to safely store the materials prior to disposal.

(iii) For the avoidance of doubt, the deposit of the following types of waste is specifically prohibited:

- (a) Any waste, not specified by Condition 2(i) above and listed in Appendix A.
- (b) Any waste containing any fibrous asbestos.
- (c) Any Difficult or Special waste in a container that is not labelled to clearly show its contents or is in a condition likely to allow the contents to leak.
- (d) Any Difficult or Special waste in a container the capacity of which is greater than 5 litres.
- (e) Any clinical waste

SITE PREPARATION

MOD 2/5/RS

or keeping

3. No deposit of waste shall take place unless an area on which vehicles may drive, turn or park is located, constructed and maintained as detailed in the Working Plan to achieve the following standard:

- (i) It shall have a hard surface capable of being swept and of taking loaded commercial vehicles without deformation.
- (ii) It shall be laid to a fall to prevent ponding of water on its surface.
- (iii) It shall be kept in good repair and any crack or pothole shall be filled up and resurfaced without undue delay and within 28 days if so requested by an authorised officer of the Waste Regulation Authority.

MOD 2/5/RS At all times

4. No deposit of waste shall take place unless gates and fencing are provided, maintained and operated as detailed in the Working Plan to achieve the following standard:

- (i) The facility shall be provided with fencing constructed as detailed in the Working Plan to a height of at least 1.8 metres.
- (ii) The facility shall be provided with gates constructed as detailed in the Working Plan to a height of at least 1.8 metres.
- (iii) Access gates to the facility shall be closed and securely locked at all times when the facility is closed or unmanned.
- (iv) All reasonable precautions shall be taken to prevent unauthorised access to the facility.
- (v) Gates and fencing shall be regularly inspected and maintained. Any damage shall be repaired without undue delay or within 14 days if so requested by an authorised officer of the Waste Regulation Authority. Any temporary repair work required to comply with Condition 4 (iv) above shall be carried out by the end of the working day on which the damage occurs.

5. No deposit of waste shall take place unless the facility is provided with a system of drainage and surface water control as detailed in the Working Plan to achieve the following standard:

- (i) The drainage system shall prevent the uncontrolled accumulation or discharge of surface water or polluted liquids from within the facility and the pollution of water.
- (ii) Surface drains of sufficient capacity to channel surface water away from the facility shall be constructed at the locations shown in the Working Plan.

- (iii) The surface water drainage system shall be regularly inspected as detailed in the Working Plan and kept free of mud, debris and oil to the extent necessary to perform its function.

6. No deposit of waste shall take place unless the site is provided with infrastructure as listed below and as detailed in the Working Plan:

- (a) A site control office.
- (b) Skips or containers into which waste delivered to the facility may be deposited and stored.
- (c) Skips, containers or bays into which materials segregated for recycling may be deposited.
- (d) Lockable stores for equipment used for the day to day operation of the facility.
- (e) Safety railings or safety steps as appropriate to allow the public safe access to the waste containers.
- (f) Warning notices relating to the areas prohibited for public access and the danger to unsupervised children and animals on the site.
- (g) Advisory notices relating to areas reserved for the segregation of specified wastes.

MOD 2/5/95 At all times

7. No deposit of waste shall be made unless all tanks and containers, used for the storage of fuel oil, waste oil or other chemicals, forming part of the facility are provided at the location shown in the Working Plan. They shall be constructed and maintained in accordance with the Working Plan to achieve the following standard:

- (i) They shall be situated on an impermeable base and shall be surrounded by a liquid tight bund wall for which no drainage outlet is provided.
- (ii) The capacity of the bund shall not be less than 110% of the capacity of the largest tank.
- (iii) The bund shall be situated such that it is able to contain any spillage resulting from a rupture of any tank.
- (iv) The stability of the bund shall be sufficient to contain any spillage which could result from the rupture of the largest tank.
- (v) All draw and fill pipes and sight gauges shall be within the curtilage of the bund and vent pipes shall be directed downwards into the bund.
- (vi) All tanks shall be labelled to show their contents.
- (vii) Any rainwater and spillages from the tank shall not be allowed to accumulate within the bund area.

(viii) Tanks provided with double skins, not requiring separate bunding, shall only be used for the storage of waste oil or fuel oil. They shall only have top mounted openings and shall be checked at least weekly for leakage of the inner skin.

8. No deposit of waste shall be made unless the facility is provided with adequate access for vehicles to:

(i) Manoeuvre and park to enable users of the facility to deposit waste into the appropriate container or bay; and

(ii) Manoeuvre, load and unload to allow the removal of waste and recovered materials from the facility and the return of empty containers to the facility.

9. No deposit of waste shall take place unless a site notice board of durable material and finish has been displayed at the site entrance showing the following information:

- (a) The name of the facility.
- (b) The categories of waste accepted.
- (c) The days and hours when the facility is open.
- (d) The name, address and telephone number of the operator (and his local agent, if any).
- (e) The words "The Disposal Licence for this facility was issued by the Buckinghamshire County Council".

The lettering used shall be a minimum of 25mm in height. The notice board shall be maintained in a legible condition.

#### SITE SUPERVISION

MOD 2/5/95 At all times

10. No deposit of waste or use of any plant or equipment shall take place unless the facility is manned and supervised as detailed in the Working Plan to achieve the following standard:

(i) There shall be a minimum of one person manning the facility at all times that the facility is open for the deposit of waste.

(ii) There shall be a minimum of one person monitoring the nature of wastes brought to the site for disposal at all times that the facility is open for the deposit of waste.

(iii) Facilities acting as recycling centres or accepting sufficient waste for which a charge is made requiring the attention of site personnel shall be manned and supervised as detailed in the Working Plan to ensure that Condition 10(ii) is complied with at all times.

(iv) Persons delivering waste to the facility shall not be permitted to deposit their waste unless it has been visually inspected by a competent person and found to comply with Condition 2.

- (v) If unauthorised waste is nevertheless deposited it shall be removed for temporary storage in the area designated in the Working Plan. The Waste Regulation Authority shall be informed immediately by telephone, and a record shall be kept, of any such incidences. All such action as the Authority may require to dispose safely of such material shall be taken.

11. No deposit of waste shall take place unless the terms of the Disposal Licence including the current Working Plan are made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management or control of the facility. A copy of this Licence and the Working Plan shall be displayed at the site control office.

mod 2/5/95 or keeping

12. No deposit of waste shall take place unless records relating to the deposit and removal of waste are maintained at the location detailed in the Working Plan for inspection during working hours by an authorised officer of the Waste Regulation Authority. The form in which records shall be kept and the nature and frequency of statistical returns made to the Waste Regulation Authority, shall at all times be in accordance with the following standard:

- (i) A record shall be kept of all industrial and commercial waste deposited at the facility which shall include the type, quantity, source (District for Shire Counties or Borough for Metropolitan Counties) and date of deposit.
- (ii) A record shall be kept of all waste leaving the facility which shall include the type, quantity and destination site for wastes and the type and quantity of recovered materials.
- (iii) A quarterly return shall be made to the Waste Regulation Authority for each of the three month periods commencing January, April, July and October of each year which shall consist of a summary of recorded information for that period. The return shall be submitted within 28 days of the last day of the period to which it relates. It shall be submitted on forms as shown in Appendix B.
- (iv) The return shall provide information for the period, expressed in terms of the total quantity, by weight (tonnes) or volume (cubic metres), of waste deposited at the facility, and of materials removed from the facility. Waste inputs shall be included for each District or Borough in which the waste arises. Waste and material outputs shall be included for each destination site.
- (v) For the purpose of the return, waste inputs as required by Condition 12(iv) shall be quantified by category, as detailed in Appendix A, as follows:

- (vi) For the purpose of the return, material outputs as required by Condition 12(iv) shall be quantified by type of material as follows:

- (vii) The operator shall provide free of charge any sample or analysis of any substance applicable to disposal operations at the facility which the Waste Regulation Authority may reasonably request.

OPERATIONS

*MO 2/5/95 At all times*

13. No deposit of waste shall take place other than in accordance with the following conditions:

- (i) Waste shall not be deposited or plant and equipment used at the facility outside the following hours:

Weekdays 0800 to 1800  
Saturdays 0800 to 1800  
Sundays 0800 to 1800

- (ii) No deposit of waste shall take place other than during daylight unless the public access and working areas are illuminated.

14. No deposit *or keeping* of waste shall take place unless wastes and recyclable materials are handled as detailed in the Working Plan to achieve the following standards:

- (i) Waste shall not be stored in containers in excess of four days from the date of deposit unless the material has been segregated as recyclable and its presence on site is not likely to cause pollution of water or offensive odours.

- (ii) Waste shall only be deposited and stored in designated containers, and recyclable materials shall only be stored in properly designed and labelled bays, except in the following circumstances:
- (a) The waste is wholly inert (such as soils and hardcore); or
  - (b) The waste is deposited on a concrete or similarly surfaced area, as detailed in the Working Plan, which drains to an oil and silt interceptor before discharging to sewer or cess pit.
- (iii) Waste which is deposited on a designated concrete area shall be loaded into the appropriate container as soon as is practical and not longer than two days after the deposits were made.
- ~~(iv) Asbestos waste received at the facility shall be handled in accordance with the following standard:~~
- ~~(a) Asbestos waste shall be segregated and stored in a designated container unless the load containing the asbestos is to be taken to a site licenced to accept cement asbestos waste and it is safe to do so.~~
  - ~~(b) Asbestos waste which is placed in a container other than the designated container shall be dampened and placed so as not to allow the release of asbestos fibres.~~

- (v) Batteries shall be handled in the manner detailed in the Working Plan such that their contents are not spilled or otherwise allowed to escape from their casing in accordance with the following standard:
- (a) Batteries shall be stored in an acid-proof bunded area which will prevent the escape of any of the contents of the batteries or any contaminated liquid.
  - (b) Spillages and rainwater shall not be allowed to accumulate within the bunded area but shall be removed and disposed of in a manner appropriate to prevent a danger to public health or risk of water pollution.
- (vi) Gas cylinders delivered to the facility shall be stored in a secure location as specified in the Working Plan in accordance with appropriate regulations to achieve the following standard:
- (a) Gas cylinders shall not be stored with waste or in containers designated for waste.

- (b) Any gas cylinders which have contained flammable, noxious or toxic gases shall only be accepted at the facility if the contents have been vented.
- (vii) Waste oil delivered in small containers or drums shall be transferred into the waste oil tank without delay. Drums of waste oil shall not be stored on site other than within an oil tight bunded area.
- (viii) The design of the site and the procedure for waste segregation shall at all times ensure that only compatible wastes are stored together.

 15. No deposit of waste shall take place unless the facility is maintained in a tidy condition as detailed in the Working Plan to achieve the following standard:

- (i) Loose debris, waste and other materials shall not be left laying on or about the facility or the access thereto, but shall be removed not less frequently than once each week and disposed of in a suitable manner.
- (ii) Litter shall be cleared from fences and gates at least daily.
- (iii) Litter and other materials shall at all times be contained within the boundaries of the facility. Any materials which have been blown by the wind beyond the boundary of the facility shall be collected and returned to the facility with the minimum of delay.

 16. No deposit of waste shall take place unless the discharge of any surface water, either directly or indirectly, from the site to any surface water, underground water or sewer has been formally agreed with the relevant water authority.

No deposit of waste shall take place unless the hardstanding areas of the facility and access to them are clear of mud or debris at least to the extent necessary to prevent fouling of the public highway. They shall be inspected daily, and if necessary cleaned, in accordance with the procedures detailed in the Working Plan.

 18. No deposit of waste shall take place unless precautions are taken, as detailed in the Working Plan, to deal effectively with any vermin or non-beneficial insects at the facility in accordance with the following standard:

- (i) The entire facility shall be routinely inspected and disinfection measures applied as necessary.
- (ii) A record shall be kept at the facility of such measures.

MOD 2/5/95 At all times

19. No deposit of waste shall take place unless the following conditions are being complied with in order to protect public health and the amenities of the locality.

- (i) Any dust generated within the facility is suppressed as detailed in the Working Plan.
- (ii) No waste material shall be burnt within the boundaries of the facility. A fire at the facility shall be regarded as an emergency and immediate action shall be taken to extinguish it. All outbreaks of fire shall be notified forthwith to the Waste Regulation Authority.
- (iii) In the event that any waste deposited at the facility is found to be generating offensive odours which cannot be contained or dissipated within the facility the waste shall immediately be removed from the facility for disposal at a suitably licenced facility. Odours shall be suppressed so as to protect public health and the amenities of the locality.

INDUSTRIAL, COMMERCIAL AND HOUSEHOLD WASTES permitted by this licence are listed below. For the purpose of the quarterly return they are classed as Category A (inert), Category B (solid degradable), Category C (solid putrescible), and Category R (Difficult) wastes.

Category A wastes are solid or granular materials as listed below which either do not decompose or decompose only very slowly and are virtually insoluble in water. They should be clean and dry and unmixed with other wastes.

CATEGORY A: INERT WASTE

Category B wastes are solid, granular or broken materials as listed below which may decompose slowly, but are only slightly soluble in water. They should be clean and dry, and unmixed with other wastes:

Wood and wood products (including all hard and soft woods, sawdust, sanderdust, cardboard, fibreboard, hardboard, chipboard, painted or treated wood)  
Trees, bushes  
Paper (including oiled and tarred paper)  
Scrap metal (see below if reclaimed)  
Domestic appliances  
Leather (excluding leather processing waste)  
Wool, cotton, linen, hemp, sisal, hessian, string, rope and any other natural or man-made fibre  
Cork, ebonite, kapok  
Boiler scale (uncontaminated with toxic metals)  
Carbon, kieselguhr, diatomaceous earth  
Calcium carbonate, calcium sulphate (gypsum), calcium chloride, magnesium carbonate  
Hydroxides of iron and calcium

Category C wastes are solid or granular material from the following list which may decompose rapidly and may contain soluble matter which could cause pollution if allowed to enter ground or surface water systems. They should be dry materials, unmixed with other wastes:

Waste food or materials that include food/vegetable matter  
Empty containers  
Garden, horticultural waste (excluding chemicals and liquids)  
Trees, bushes  
Animal carcasses or processing waste

Cellulose waste  
Supermarket waste  
Paper mill wastes  
Non-metallic fragmentiser wastes

CATEGORY R: OTHER





Your attention is drawn, therefore, to the following Sections of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.

2. **Section 33: Unauthorised or Harmful Deposit etc., of Waste**

It is an offence to treat, keep or dispose of controlled waste in or on any land except under and in accordance with a waste management licence. Further, it is an offence under Section 33(1)(c) to treat, keep or dispose of controlled waste in a manner likely to cause pollution of the environment or harm to human health.

A person contravening any condition of a waste management licence commits an offence, irrespective of whether or not waste is being deposited at the time.





a) the addition of new condition 26 and 27 below

26. The financial provision for meeting the obligations under this licence set out in the Agreement made between the holder and the Agency dated 30 March 2001 shall be maintained by the holder throughout the subsistence of this Licence and the holder shall produce evidence of such provision whenever required by the Agency.

27. A site diary shall be kept secure and shall be available for inspection at the site when required by an authorised officer of the Agency. This shall include a record of the following events:

- i) Start and finish of construction work and certification;
- ii) Start and finish of waste management processes carried out on site;
- iii) Plant maintenance and breakdowns;
- iv) Emergencies;
- v) Problems with waste received and actions taken;
- vi) Sampling exercises; site inspections, their findings and the remedial responses;
- vii) Dispatch of records to the Environment Agency;
- viii) Weather, including severe conditions and environmental problems and remedial actions;
- ix) The attendance of the technically competent manager shall be recorded in the site diary by noting arrival and departure times.

Each record shall be completed within 24 hours of the relevant event.




