Dear [REDACTED],

I have now had a chance to review the information you sent me last year.

After reviewing the information and talking with [REDACTED] (permitting officer for the site) I am happy that the information submitted is enough to characterise the site for permit surrender. I would however suggest further clarification on the points below:

BH1101: Why does a different sampling technique give different results for TPH-GRO?

BH304: I can find no reference to the distance from BH304 to the surrounding extra boreholes drilled (304-1,304-2,304-3 & 304-4). This will help validate the remedial measure undertaken to excavate and area 2m x 2m.

I also note that there were some solid residues left within vessels. During further decommissioning/demolition it should be documented what procedures were followed to ensure no release of residual materials to the environment. Les informed me that he understood this was being undertaken and that he was comfortable that pollution prevention measures were in place.

I would also like to remind you that any contamination within the site from historical processes may require further characterisation and potentially remedial measures but this would not fall within the permitting regime. I would recommend that the requirements of PPS23 and the Environment Agency guidance 'Guiding Principles for Land Contamination' should be followed.
